# Draft minutes of the meeting held 8th July 2021 via Zoom

**Present:** S Dolan-Betney (chair), J. Riddell. (Treasurer), S. Dorey (secretary), J. Polakowska, E. Melrose and 12 members of the public.

Apologies: W. Graham, Cllr M. Williamson.

SDB thanked the CC for their prompt responses to several urgent emails, which enabled her to respond quickly.

**Minutes** of meeting held 13 May 2021 were accepted, proposed by SD, seconded by JP.

**Finance:** JR informed the meeting that the balance was £357.44. RBS paid £150 compensation for switching problems. Money to go to defibrillator pads for Lawers, Fearnan and Fortingall. RBS Digital Banking does not require payments to be authorised. CC considers this an insecure practice. JR & SDB to look at other Banks. SDB reimbursed £143 for Zoom payment. **Amenity Acc. £152.89 and Robert Campbell Cairn Memorial Fund £741.08 now amalgamated in TSB.** 

**Police report:** no police present but Commander's Bulletin updates all who are interested. New Chief Superintendent is Phil Davison. Locality Inspector for Northern Perthshire is Ashley Wallace.

#### Roads:

Closures - Wester Camusvrachan and Invervar bridge

Glen Lyon embankment work appears to be completed, apart from the resurfacing. Mills' lorries should no longer be a problem. Any other HGVs driving badly should have their licence plate details noted, firm they work for, time, place etc and reported to the firm's transport or logistics manager – they all carry tachographs so times, speed etc can be checked. Can also be reported to R. Ross (RRoss@pkc.gov.uk) or Police Scotland non -emergency number 101.

*Invervar Bridge* repairs due to start 12<sup>th</sup> July for 2 weeks, road will be closed some days but bin lorries should operate as normal.

Fearnan VAS - still waiting.

**Highland Action** Partnership – Road Safety Group Facebook – SDB attended meeting June 24: Garth site meeting request made again;

Andy Brown (AB), PKC Road Maintenance (South) and representative on Scottish Timber Transport Group reported that money for improving the passing places in Glen Lyon and signage was used at Camusvrachan. No application this year because no match-funding from PKC. Maintenance work behind schedule due to Covid so no guarantee work could be completed in specified time. AB to survey Glenlyon Passing Places prior to a funding application for next year to Strategic Timber Transport Fund and PKC match-funding.

Glenlyon Heritage Trail and Proposed Bus Route – E.mail consultation with Glen residents. CC met Cll. Williamson June 18<sup>th.</sup> Notes sent to Glen. Trail proposal dropped. Residents' permits dropped. Clearway not ideal but better than nothing. CC will continue to work with PKC on Bus Route meantime. Meeting with R. Ross July 16<sup>th</sup>. followed by letter to Glen to include timber transport and Clearway.

Cyclists – report from Glenlyon of problems caused by inconsiderate cyclists. Difficult to do anything about.

**Planning:** SDB reported on approved and pending applications since 13<sup>th</sup> May Old Lawers Village – applicants appeal was refused and village put up for sale. CC favoured it being acquired for the community. N. Hooper reported the sale had gone through. BBC Alba contacted CC for someone to interview – details of Breadalbane Heritage Society and Breadalbane Development Trust provided – N. Hooper did the interview.

Breadalbane Development Trust – C. Brook informed meeting of its origins and purpose. Trust had tried to registered an interest in Old Lawers on behalf of the community but it was blocked by the private sale. It is now processing an interest should it come on the market again.

Fortingall Hotel- J. Rees informed meeting that project steering group now under the umbrella of BDT which is acting as formal body for funding. Feasibility study to establish wider needs of community. This in turn could lead to a Community Development Plan – CC indicated an interest.

**Loch Tay:** Kenmore CC have a meeting tonight to discuss Loch Tay code of contact etc. Safer Communities Team developing a County-wide code to be supplemented by local variations. P. Ely and SDB forming a sub-group to look at the particular needs of Lochs Tay, Tummel and Rannoch. A sea plane has been using the loch in recent days. W. Olivier informed meeting that the plane was from Prestwick on practice flights and some years ago a local resident had the loch appointed by PKC as a sea plane air strip. S. Brain reported on the problems of swimmers in black wet suit and hat without a coloured float being almost invisible in the water.
